It's hard to believe that the Friends of the Garden City Historical Museum turns ten years old this year. We have come such a long way since Carol Bird, Muriel Grima, and Mary Jane Schildburg came up with the plan to purchase the Straight Farmhouse.

Within two years of the purchase, the Lather's General Store was opened, the Historical Museum was moved from the Log Cabin in City Park to the Straight Farmhouse, By Laws were written and a Board of Directors was in place.

Currently the Straight Farmhouse receives over 2,600 visitors annually, receives over 12,000 annual views of our website, receives 5-10 inquiries per month via the website, publishes 3-4 newsletters per year, hosts multiple special exhibits/events per year; the list goes on and on!

We are very excited about our future, and very thankful to all of our volunteers and supporters.
