Straight Farmhouse Porch Roof Rebuilt



Early this year, FGCHM member Marshall Hill and Museum Historian Jack Kerstetter discovered severe deterioration of the Straight Farmhouse porch roof at the northeast corner of the building.

Upon closer examination, it was determined that immediate repairs were necessary including demolition of the existing roof and reconstruction of the roof trusses, deck boards and asphalt shingles.

The Friends called upon John Santeiu, Jr. to provide a carpenter that he has used for many of his projects to assist in undertaking this project along with FGCHM volunteers.

The project was completed in approximately one week.

Look for Straight Farmhouse Booth at Garden City Chili Cookoff



FGCHM Studies LED Lighting for Straight Farmhouse

In an effort to reduce the monthly electric bill at the Straight Farmhouse, the



Friends of the Garden City Historical Museum Board of Directors have been researching the cost effectiveness of converting all 70 fluorescent light fixtures throughout the farmhouse to LED lighting. DTE Energy offers an Energy Efficiency Program for Business that provides incentives for business customers who upgrade their facilities with energy efficient equipment.

Friends of the Garden City Historical Museum will be making application to DTE to reserve incentives for their retrofit project which will be undertaken in the coming months. Better lighting and lower energy bills; what a bright idea!



Shivnen Family Trust Donates Land to FGCHM

For those of you who have had the opportunity to visit the Garden City Historical Museum will recall one of the first things you see is the re-creation of an early post office typically found in the general store back in the 1920's and 30's. Former Garden City Postmaster John Shivnen donated many of the archives in that post office and commissioned a skilled master carpenter to construct the intricate woodwork on the post office itself.

When Mr. Shivnen passed away, his family trust included a vacant parcel of land located on Cowan Rd. in Westland, Michigan to be donated to the Friends to sell and use the proceeds of that sale for future projects for the museum.

We are pleased to inform you that, with the invaluable assistance of Mr. John Santeiu, Jr., the property has been sold and the Friends have collected the proceeds from that sale in the amount of \$3,385.45. The Friends are sincerely grateful to the Shivnen family for their generous donation and will use the funds to preserve the Straight Farmhouse as a base to further the mission of the Friends of the Garden City Historical Museum.
