The beautiful antique stove "installed" in our Lathers General Store was a gift from Charlotte and Charles Guisgand of Garden City. It originally heated the farm home of the Mork family on Mork Road in Sutton's Bay in the Leelanau Peninsula of Michigan. Charlotte's antecedents immigrated to Northern Michigan from Norway, and lived in a log cabin from 1896 until their home was built around 1900. The farmhouse is still standing, and in fact is a Centennial Farm with a family member still living there. Originally, oats and wheat were raised on the farm, but it now has a cherry orchard on approximately 200+ acres.

At the tender age of 3 years, Charlotte opened all the drafts one day which caused the stove and stovepipe to glow red-hot and which pleased her mightily. Her father was able to extinguish the chimney fire she caused and saved the house and she remembers that she was not punished -- being so young. The stove was so efficient that it heated two upstairs bedrooms above the stove (through holes cut in the bedroom floors) during the winter in addition to heating the main floor. A furnace was installed when Charlotte was 10 or 11 years old.



About 20 years ago, Charlotte and Chuck brought the stove to their home in Garden City and installed it in their garage to heat Chuck's workshop. Some time this past year, they decided to give it to the Straight Farm House, so Chuck refurbished it totally -- even installing a stovepipe and electric logs to lend an aura of authenticity to our 1866 store replica. The stove occupies a place of honor in our Lathers General Store. It is truly a "must-see" when you visit us! This most unselfish gift of the stove, and the labor expended to display it as it "was" are so very greatly appreciated by the Friends! Thank you, Charlotte and Chuck Guisgand.
